4. INTER – DISCIPLINARY PROGRAMMES STARTED

5. EXAMINATION REFORMS IMPLEMENTED

Mount Carmel College of Teacher Education for Women is affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University. The final examinations of the B.Ed. Programme are conducted by the University. Mahatma Gandhi University introduced Credit and Semester System with grading w.e.f. 2009-'10, Therefore it was decided that the B.Ed. degree course would have two semesters. There will be 90 working days in each semester.

The B.Ed. programme includes (a) Common course (b) Core course (c) Complementary Elective course (d) Teaching competence, co-curricular activities and (e) Extension activities.

Due to the Semesterisation of the B.Ed. Programme, continuous evaluation is conducted.

- Regular examinations are conducted to ensure objectivity in assigning internal grades.
- Grading system has been implemented.
- To enable students to improve their internal grades, re-tests and re-submission of assignments are encouraged.
- For the objective evaluation of assignments, projects, seminars and other practical works, specific criteria have been formulated. To ensure transparency in the internal evaluation, grades assigned for each criterion is displayed.
- Grievance redressal cell is functioning effectively.
- The institution has formulated an Observation Schedule for the assessment of Practice Teaching lessons.
- Peer evaluation based on the Observation Schedule is conducted by students during Teaching Practice period.
- Since objective type questions have been included in the pattern of examination, students are given adequate training in attempting those questions, so as to ensure better result and performance.

Students who have economic difficulties are encouraged to apply for various scholarships.

2. Grants

Students who belonging to the SC/ST/OEC communities receive lump sum grant from the government i.e.; 865/- per year as well as full fee concession and free lodging expenses.

3. Aid for hostellers

3. a) Three boarders of the hostel who face economic difficulties are given free accommodation, the expense of which is met by the contribution of the Management.

4. Aid for day scholars

An annual stipend of Rs. 475/- is given to day scholars towards educational expenditure.
