

BACKGROUND

Mount Carmel College of Teacher Education for Women, Kottayam, established in 1953, has a rich tradition of community engagement and service. Since 1978 the college has been organizing visits for student teachers to Abhaya Bhavan. This practice has played a crucial role in nurturing empathy, social responsibility, and community involvement among the student teachers over the years.



PURPOSE

The purpose of this MOU is to establish a structured, sustainable, and effective partnership between Mount Carmel College of Teacher Education for Women, Kottayam and Abhaya Bhavan, Charitable Old Age Home run by Sisters of Missionaries of Charity. Formalizing the collaboration will enhance the quality and impact of the community service initiatives, providing clear guidelines and fostering a productive and ethical partnership.

AREAS OF COOPERATION

- Student Volunteering: Student teachers will have opportunities to volunteer at the Abhaya Bhavan, providing assistance and companionship to the residents. Abhaya Bhavan will provide a supportive environment for student teachers to grow into individuals who care for others and sensitive to the difficulties others may face. These interactions will offer student teachers valuable experiences beyond the classroom, fostering empathy, social responsibility, and a deeper understanding of the elderly.
- Recreational Activities: Student teachers will be planning and conducting recreational activities and games for the residents during their regular visits and also while celebrating days of importance such as Christmas, new year and other cultural events.
- Community Engagement: Encouraging student teachers to contribute to community-building activities and to enhance their understanding of aging and elderly care. This will encourage student teachers to explore how they can contribute positively to the well-being of the elderly in their communities, foster intergenerational connections and to create a more compassionate and inclusive society.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES

- Designate a coordinator to manage the collaboration activities during the regular visit on every Wednesdays and also while celebrating days of importance such as Christmas, new year etc.
- Ensure students are adequately prepared and supervised during their visit at Abhaya Bhavan.
- Collect and provide food items, cloths, toiletries, cleaning products and other necessary items for the inmates
- Respecting the privacy and confidentiality of the residents of Abhaya Bhavan to safeguard their dignity, safety, and well-being.


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

- B) To conduct Student faculty development Program centered on the space of human rights with a view to formulate the students more socially committed individuals.
- C) To collaborate in the areas relating to protection of human rights necessitating the intended group, the teachers and or the students as the case may be, and thereby urging them of their civil and political rights.
- To collaborate conducting Seminars/Webinars/Workshops/Symposium etc. on Human Rights and relevant applicable laws.
- E) To collaborate conducting programs in the area of Education and Teacher Training in the light of new legislations regulating the educational systems of the country.

F) Any other area of mutual interest that may likely to emerge in future.

2. IMPLEMENTATION

- A) All programmess or activities to be implemented as per this Memorandum of Understanding shall be mutually agreed upon in writing, and to include the necessary budget allocation for the programmes if needed.

- B) Any violation of the laws of the State and/or the rules of the Host Institution by an exchange participant' shall be a ground for immediate termination of the privileges of that participant for violation in view of this Agreement.

Unbound Liability.

This agreement is a statement of intentions of the parties to carry out and not involving in any instance whatsoever, creating any financial obligations onto the subscribing institutions.

6. Duration And Renewal of Agreement

This Memorandum of Understanding shall become effective immediately after it is duly signed by the representatives of both the Parties for a period of Five Years from the said date and is subject to renewal at the option of both the Parties.
