Each year, a variety of academic and co-curricular activities are organized to cater to these diversities. While preparing the timetable, provisions are made for mentoring, remedial teaching, value-added courses, self-study courses, and extension activities.

MENTORING

The college has a sound mentoring system. During the Orientation Session, students were introduced to the mentoring system. The student teachers are assigned to different faculty members. The mentoring sessions are carried out as per the time table. Each mentor maintains a record for each mentee, including personal, family, and academic profiles, as well as a performance chart covering both academic and co-curricular areas. One hour is devoted for mentor-mentee interaction every week. During the meetings, students are given personal and academic guidance and support in dealing with the problems. Group mentoring sessions are provided for common topics.










COLLABORATIVE TASKS
